Amy Richards

Amy is a returning director. After a year break, she is joining the BCGA board again as she has a passion for sharing viticulture knowledge and building community. Amy's impressive career was launched after obtaining a Bachelor of Viticultural Science from the University of Adelaide in Australia, after which she travelled to New Zealand to purse her interest in cool climate viticulture and winemaking. Her research on irrigation lead to a keynote address at several prestigious conferences and the award of Australian Viticulturist of the Year in 2012. In 2009, Amy joined Treasury Wine Estates and then in 2015, was relocated to California where she managed their portfolio of grower contracts in the Napa Valley. In 2020, inspired by the region's potential to produce outstanding red wine grapes, Amy relocated with her family to the Okanagan Valley. She is currently the Senior Viticulturist at Sebastian Farms.

Jody Subotin

Jody grew up in vineyards, starting in 1996 during his summer breaks from school. He began his career at Hawthorn Mountain Vineyards in 1997 and by 1999 he served as vineyard manager. In 2000 he moved to Osoyoos Larose, the perfect place to learn advanced vineyard practices from Bordeaux. From there, Jody lead teams who were planting vineyards from the ground up – clearing the land, installing irrigation, installing trellising systems, planting the vines and everything else vine related.

During this time, he was introduced to biodynamic agriculture. He is currently the Vineyard Manager and Managing Partner at Le Vieux Pin and Lastella Wineries.

Jarnail Brar

Jarnail comes from a farming family, growing up picking berries in Abbotsford. His family moved to Oliver in1999 and bought a vineyard on Black Sage bench. They now own over 100 acres with vineyards, orchards and ground crops. Jarnail likes the challenges of farming, that every year brings something new. He sees benefits in building community with growers and the opportunity it brings to share knowledge, adapt, and keep the industry moving forward.

Dapinder Gill

Dapinder began working in vineyards as a summer job while he was working towards his Bachelor of Business at UBCO.
